# GUILDFORD ASSOCIATION MEETING TUESDAY JUNE 20, 2023, 7.30PM ST MATTHEWS' CHURCH HALL, STIRLING SQUARE, GUILDFORD

Mr John Viska, Chair of the Australian Garden History Society of WA, will



present a talk on Ms Nancy Grasby, a past resident of Guildford and landscape architect from the early part of the 20th century. Nancy lived at 2 Turton Street and her father was prominent in the agricultural industry and wrote horticultural articles for the West Australian newspaper. Nancy was one of three noted women Landscape Architects from WA who made a successful career from garden design and landscape architecture.

John will also have available some copies of the newly released book on Perth gardens, 'Historic Gardens of Perth European settlement to Modernism.' (\$50).

The free talk will be followed by supper and general meeting.

#### **VAUDEVILLE THEATRE PLANS**

The City of Swan has received a DA for the Vaudeville theatre in James St, Guildford. The final decision is with a Joint Development Assessment Panel (JDAP). The GA has parking and traffic concerns.

The licensees of the hotel are proposing expansion by linking the hotel and theatre and turning the theatre into a




tavern and beer garden. It is proposed to operate Sun to Thurs 11am - 10pm; Fri to Sat 11am-12am. There will be no onsite parking. The proponent estimates they will need 192 car bays which they say can be found in street parking within 200m of the building.

Note, the bays in the car park at the rear of the Guildford Hotel are for the hotel, as well as a retail development that will be delivered at a future stage.

The City of Swan's Design Review panel comments that "Lack of onsite parking in this context should not seen as an issue - it is progressive thinking." The GA has concerns about the impact of such a large parking shortfall on surrounding streets and the primary school at pick-up time. The closing date for submissions is June 24.
