Current Actions & Plans

The next meeting of the Association will be held on 18th November 2008 at the Mechanic's Institute Hall from 7.30 pm. This will be the last meeting of the year as we do not have a meeting in December. There is always tea, coffee and snacks provided to provision the members as they discuss the Association's business. New members are very welcome, fees are very reasonable and you are encouraged to attend and contribute towards preserving Guildford. Membership details are given below.

The Association remains concerned about the **proposed street names** in the new residential development on James Street. The new streets have been named Berislav Mews, Blato Lane and Karbuni Court. The Association and a number of concerned residents have been lobbying hard to have the street names overturned. It is considered that these names are totally inappropriate in Guildford. Guildford is a colonial town with existing road names which represent the pioneers, original landowners and geography of the locality. Guildford's public thoroughfares have the traditional designations of "Street", "Road" or "Avenue" and the use of "Mews", "Lane" and "Court" are also inappropriate.

The Association feels that the City of Swan and Landgate (Geographic Names Committee) have erred in deciding that the road names are acceptable in Guildford.

There is still the opportunity for this matter to be rectified and for the Guildford community to have a say on the road names. The Association urgently needs your assistance in this regard. The Minister for Lands has the power to overturn this matter but time is of the essence.

If you feel that these road names are inappropriate, you should communicate this to **Mr Brendon Grylls** who is the **Minister for Lands**. You can do this

Don't forget to use your local services, in particular the **Guildford Library**. The Library is under constant review by the City of Swan and it would be a tragedy to lose this facility. All local roads in Guildford have a **50kph speed** limit in accordance with the Road Traffic Code 2000. Please drive carefully and with consideration on our local roads. Helena Street is particularly notorious for through traffic and drivers avoiding James Street and the signalised intersections.
