### **Guildford Hotel**

The remains of the Guildford Hotel stand as a stark reminder of how fragile our history is and how quickly it can be lost. If public statements and newspaper reports are to be believed then it would appear that the intention of the owners is to restore the building. The Guildford Association welcomes this vision and would like to support and lobby for any action that leads to its rebuilding. There are well documented plans for the building which should allow a faithful restoral of this Guildford landmark

**Saturday 18<sup>th</sup> - Lead Light Walk** – The Guildford Association invites visitors to tour their National Trust classified town, to view a microcosm of W.A. history through its windows. A range of heritage homes, civic buildings and church lead lights can be viewed in an informative, relaxed stroll through the tree lined streets in Guildford on the evening of 18<sup>th</sup> October from about 6.30 to 10.00 pm. There will be two set routes and people can either join a guided tour with a group leader or stroll along on a self-guided tour with the information & map provided by the Association. Each tour is designed to take about an hour. The guided tours are \$8.50 per person and the self-guided tours will be \$5.00 per person. The Association urges Guildford residents to make use of the Guildford Library and its wide range of services. The library is located on the corner of Meadow Street and James Street with parking access off Meadow Street. They can be contacted on 9378 1770 for further details and opening times. In today's world of accountability, the City of Swan is under constant pressure to ensure reasonable return on investment. If Guildford wants to retain its local library then the residents must be seen to use it. It has a wide range of services - suitable for everyone from children to retirees - including talking books, videos, large print books, CD's and up-to-date journals, papers, gardening magazines etc. It is also the repository for a number of public documents that are open to comment from the public which would otherwise need to be down-loaded from the internet or residents would have to travel into Midland to be able to access them. "Use it or lose it" is a fair expression for our library situation and the Association is very keen that we do not lose a community resource.

It is considered that they (Blatto, Berislav & Karpuni) do not reflect the pioneering names of the Colonial township and the Association would encourage alternative options in the naming of these streets. The Association is also concerned at the large walls around the development. They are inconsistent with the Guildford Design Guidelines, are not sympathetic with to the historic character of our town and do nothing to enhance the Guildford. Concerned residents are encouraged to write to the City of Swan (PO Box 196, Midland, 6936), our local MLA Michelle Roberts (PO Box 1792, Midland 6936) &/or Minister of Lands (Level 9 East, Dumas House, 2 Havelock Street, West Perth 6005 and voice their opinion.
